

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Know Your Structure

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Always organize your speeches clearly: start with a strong introduction, build well-supported arguments, and finish with a powerful conclusion. A clear structure keeps your message focused and makes it easier for judges and audiences to follow. Remember to use AREI (Assertion, Reasoning, Evidence, Impact) when building your arguments—it's a simple but powerful tool to keep your points sharp and persuasive!
